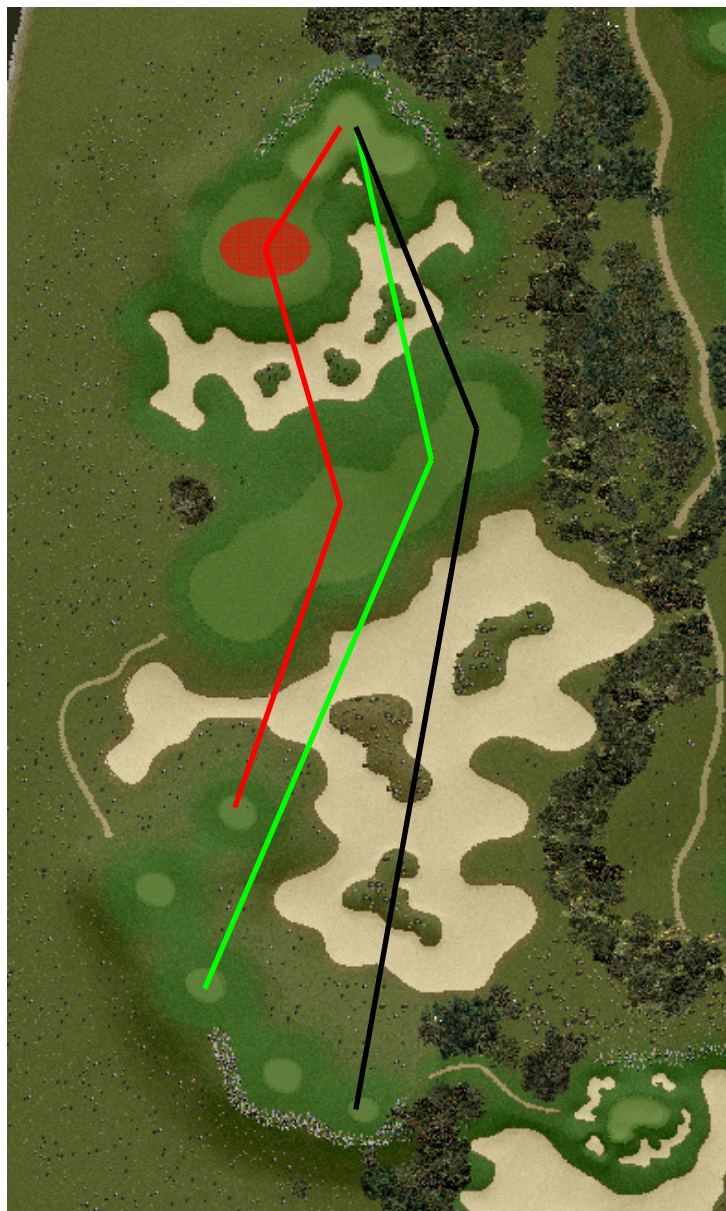




MULTIPLE TEES EXAMPLE - 12TH HOLE



RED ROUTE - BEGINNER

IDEALLY NO FORWARD TEES WOULD PRESENT A FORCED CARRY GIVEN THE LIKELIHOOD OF A POOR OR 'TOPPED' SHOT, HOWEVER THE CARRY HERE IS SHORT AND FINDING THE FAIRWAY IS RELATIVELY EASY.

THERE IS A LAYUP OPTION (RED HOT SPOT) FOR THE WEAKER PLAYER ON THEIR SECOND SHOT TO ALLOW FOR BETTER COURSE MANAGEMENT. A SHORT PITCH FOR THE 3RD SHOT WILL PRESENT A GOOD CHANCE FOR A PAR OR BOGEY PUTT.

GREEN ROUTE - AMATEUR

YOU CAN BE AS AGGRESSIVE AS YOU WISH WITH YOUR DRIVE DEPENDING ON PIN LOCATION. IF IT IS ON THE RIGHT, A BRAVER DRIVE OVER THE PROGRESSIVE CARRY WILL BE REWARDED WITH A SHORTER SHOT AND BETTER LINE IN TO THE GREEN. A CONSERVATIVE DRIVE TO THE LEFT OR CENTRE OF THE FAIRWAY WILL PRESENT A LONGER APPROACH TO THE LEFT PIN, A TOUGHER CARRY OVER THE BUNKER TO THE BACK PIN, AND A VERY DIFFICULT APPROACH TO THE RIGHT PIN

BLACK ROUTE - TOUR PRO

THE ANGLE FROM THE BACK TEE FORCES THE PRO TO TAKE ON A TOUGH CARRY TO BE REWARDED WITH THE SHORTER SHOT AND BETTER LINE IN. IT SIGNIFICANTLY INCREASES THE DIFFICULTY OF THE TEE SHOT AND WOULD NOT BE AN APPROPRIATE CHALLENGE FOR AN AMATEUR GOLFER.
